

HLT41115 Certificate IV in Health Care

AT A GLANCE

Class duration: The Cert IV program consists of:

- ▶ Self-paced eLearning - before and after the face to face sessions
- ▶ Face to face scenario based learning sessions (all learning materials and equipment will be supplied):
 - ▶ 4 day face to face Cert IV course (for those who have completed HLTSS00027 Occupational First Aid Skill Set within the last 18 months and are working in a Industrial Medic or first aid support role.)
 - ▶ 6 day face to face Cert IV course (for those who have completed HLTSS00027 Occupational First Aid Skill Set within the last 18 months, but are not working in a Industrial Medic or first aid support role)
- ▶ Minimum 80 hours clinical work placement

Time-frame for completion: The HLT41115 Certificate IV in Health Care must be completed within 12 months from the beginning of the face to face sessions.

St John Entry Requirements: Participants to hold a current HLTSS00027 Occupational First Aid Skill Set certificate (completed within the last 18 months) and be minimum 18 years of age.

USI required: Yes

Recertification: St John Ambulance WA recommends that you refresh your first aid skills every 12 months. This is also in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines that state CPR skills should be refreshed every 12 months.

Description:

The HLT41115 Certificate IV in Health Care (Cert IV) qualification is designed to meet the needs of professionals who provide emergency response services within the mining, industrial or corporate sectors.

The qualification is delivered within a replicated Industrial Medic environment at our Bassendean training centre, with simulated drills, exercises and industry specific scenarios. The minimum 80 hour clinical work placement component of the program can be achieved through St John Ambulance WA by attending shifts with Ambulance, Patient Transfer and Event Health Services teams*.

Clinical Placements can also be completed at the participants workplace medical facility (subject to approval from St John Ambulance).

*Please note: *Participants will first need to meet the requirements and become a registered Volunteer with St John Ambulance WA.*

Content:

The face to face sessions are delivered as a fast paced, scenario based training and assessment course. This course includes the following units of competency – nine core units, and seven pre-determined electives.

Core Units of Competency included:

1. CHCDIV001 Work with diverse people
2. HLTAAP002 Confirm physical health status
3. HLTAMB001 Follow procedures for routine safe removal of patient
4. HLTAMB007 Assess and deliver basic clinical care
5. HLTAMB011 Manage a routine non-emergency scene
6. HLTAMB012 Communicate in complex situations to support health care
7. HLTINF001 Comply with infection prevention and control policies and procedures
8. HLTWHS002 Follow safe work practices for direct client care.
9. HLTWHS006 Manage personal stressors in the work environment

Elective Units of Competency included:

1. HLTAMB002 Implement safe access and egress in an emergency
2. BSBMED301 Interpret and apply medical terminology appropriately
3. BSBFLM303 Contribute to effective workplace relationships
4. HLTWHS001 Participate in workplace health and safety

7. PUAEME005A Provide pain management
